# Musings on New Regime VS. Old Regime –Taxation for Individual (light read, non-technical)

The income tax return filing season is here. After the financial year ends, all involved in any kind of financial activities get busy in arranging records that tell a picture of financial performance during the past year. The records are also arranged to enable one to discharge our duty of sharing the hard-earned income for collective national progress — pay the taxes on income. Because as Mr. Benjamin Franklin famously said, nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes.

Taxation for Individuals & HUF is based on slab rate meaning that the rates increase with income. However, the taxation system as we knew it went a paradigm shift from FY 2020-21 onwards. A taxpayer was accustomed to plan his savings, insurances, pension etc based on the income tax 'deductions'. Then there were other deductions - on donations, medical expenses, on interest earned, on new employee cost etc. Yet other benefits too in the form of 'exemption'.

Then came the advent of 'new tax regime' which is an optional slab rate. This regime is touted to be simpler with less complexities.

The major differentiation being that the new regime takes away most of the 'deductions' and 'exemptions'. The parameters of both regimes cannot be parallelly compared. Each case needs its own comparison to find out the beneficial regime. Till the FY 2022-23 roughly, ~ INR17 lakhs income was the point where the new regime got beneficial. But there has been a revision in tax rates since FY 2023-24. These new rates in new tax regime has now made it more lucrative than an year ago. Now in the new regime, there is no tax for income upto Rs 7 lakhs. Then again if you have a deduction of investments, Mediclaim, pension scheme, interest on self-occupied home loan upto Rs 2L then you get a good deduction of almost Rs 4lakhs in old regime. Therefore, there is no straight-jacket formula to find out the more beneficial regime.

What practically transpires as a direct affect is that the concept of wealth creation, created by using taxation as a tool has given way to simpler regimes. With taxpayers slowly but surely moving on to new regime, many individual financial decisions will now cease to have the angle of income tax. Life insurance and mediclaims will no longer be sold with the income tax angle. Donation to charitable organizations will become purely donations and no benefit shall accrue to the donor in form of income tax.

A good tax calculator is available on incometaxindia.gov.in if you want to have a fare idea where you stand. But then, as the whispers say, it might not be long till you have to juggle between the options. A simpler option may be all that we have to deal with. Till then, enjoy the juggling.
